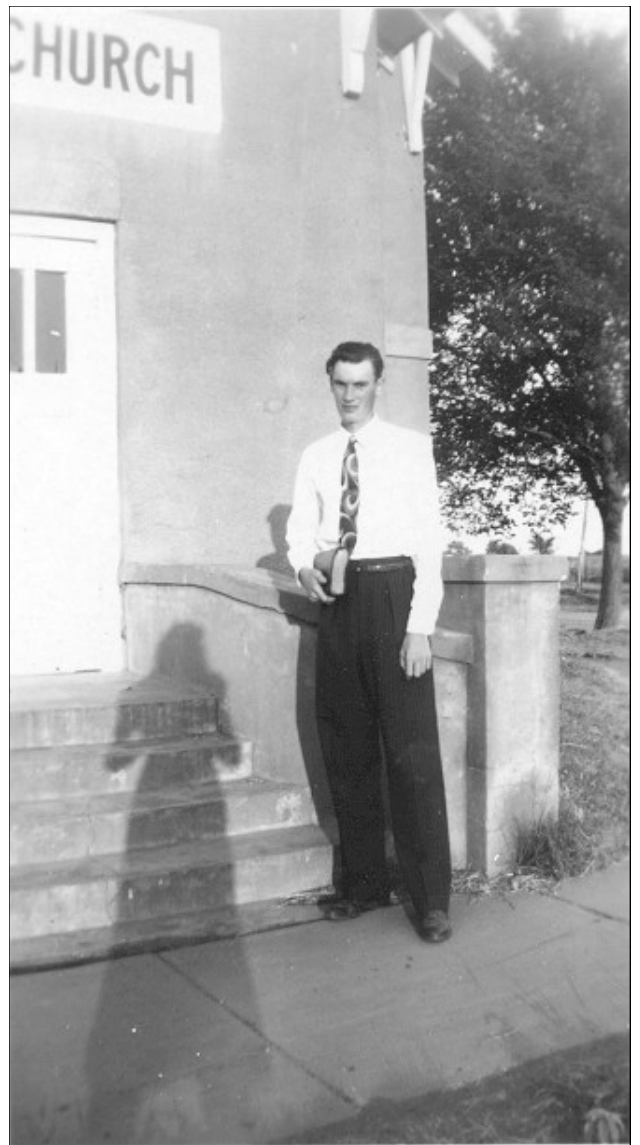


Jay Dee Dunn

(1923 - 1951)

Jay Dee Dunn attended the Grace and Glory Bible School in Kansas City, Missouri where he met and there married Deborah Bennington in 1946. There were brief periods of pastoring and ministry (*right at Jennings, Oklahoma*), but the most of Jay Dee and Deborah's ministry efforts were as missionaries among the Navajo Indian in Grants Pass, New Mexico. Deborah always recalled the somewhat primitive conditions such as the mud Hogan dwellings used by the Navajo.

Jay Dee contracted tuberculosis while there and he, Deborah with their baby son, Danny, found it necessary to return to Oklahoma where he died April 13, 1951. His over capacity funeral service was attended by friends from six different states and by 23 ministers and each made brief comments. Brother O.W. Webb officiated the memorial service

The funeral services were conducted in the Dixie Community Church near Cleveland, Oklahoma in the neighborhood where he was reared. The church was not large enough to accommodate the crowd who came to pay tribute to our brother. Twenty-three ministers attended the service, and each minister made a few comments. Friends from six states attended the service, and the presence of the Lord was felt throughout the entire service. Our deepest sympathy is extended to his dear companion, Deborah and their son, Danny. We ask that you especially pray for her that God will direct her.
